Office of Secretary of Veterans & Defense Affairs:

 - \circ Ranked 2^{nd} in best overall economic environment;
 - o Ranked 2nd in the lowest percentage of homeless Veterans;
 - o Ranked 3rd in the highest percentage of Veteran-owned business;
 - o Ranked 4th in overall quality of life;
 - o Ranked 4th in the highest Veterans per capita.
- Maintained key support and leadership role in Virginia Emergency Operations Center;
- Governor's Office submitted request of Title 32 status for Virginia National Guard until August 31, 2020; VNG currently on Title 32 orders until June 24, 2020.
- Provided outreach and updates to Radford's Chamber of Commerce.
- Travelled with Governor Northam to Charlottesville to thank Guardsmen on the front lines of testing.
- Held discussions with the three Directors of the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs' Medical Centers.
- Provided an update on the Commonwealth's response to the pandemic during a virtual meeting of the Northern Virginia Regional Council Community and Military Partnership Meeting.
- Engaged with Association of Defense Communities (ADC) to attend webinars focused on studying how the COVID-19 pandemic will change the U.S. Military as well as the delivery of healthcare.
- Attended Memorial Day Flag placement ceremony at Amelia State Veterans Cemetery on May 21.

- Deployed 34th CBRNE Enhanced Response Force Package (CERF-P) teams across the Commonwealth to support expanded COVID testing and point prevalence operations, PPE and decontamination coaching:
 - o 14,828 point prevalence testing samples conducted across 40 locations;
 - o **1,976** Community-based test samples collected at **6** locations;
 - o **2,819** test samples transported to various lab locations;
 - o **1,491** N95/PPE fittings.
 - o 73,603 pounds of food distributed.
 - *All numbers are cumulative as of 22 May.
- Continued planning and preparation with Virginia Department of Health (VDH) to coordinate support to the Governor's Long-Term Care Facility Task Force;
- Fulfilled mission assignments requested through emergency management process, to include logistics support, planning, mobile testing assistance and medical planning;
- Celebrated 413th service birthday on May 14.
